Must You Believe in Jesus to Be Saved?

A. **Universalism:** everyone is saved.

Origen and Rob Bell—human freedom

B. **Pluralism:** According to a 2008 survey by Pew Forum on Religion & Public life, 47% of white evangelicals agreed that "many religions can lead to eternal life." See http://pewforum.org/docs/?DocID=380. A 2008 survey by LifeWay Research (SBC) found "only" 20% of evangelicals agreed that "If a person is sincerely seeking God, he/she can obtain eternal life through religions other than Christianity." C. **Inclusivism:** anyone who responds to the revelation they have will be saved, whether or not they know and believe in Jesus. E.g., C. S. Lewis, Christopher Wright, Vatican 2 Roman Catholicism.

The New Catechism of the Catholic church states that "Those who, **through no fault of their own**, do not know the Gospel of Christ or his Church, but who nevertheless seek God with a sincere heart, and, moved by grace, try in their actions to do his will as they know it through the dictates of their conscience—those too may achieve eternal salvation."

D. **Exclusivism:** salvation only comes through believing in Jesus (Romans 10:8-17; 1 Thessalonians 2:16; John 3:1-18; entire book of Acts)
